The most important rule about the job market and publishing

Don't bore your friends with endless complaining about the job market and publishing.



Journal submission

Publishing is typically a long and difficult process.

One of my papers was recently accepted at *Theoretical Economics*.

This paper was first submitted to a journal in 2015.

The paper was submitted to *Theoretical Economics* in June 2016.

The paper was accepted for publication in January 2019.

While this process was long and at times frustrating, the final paper is much better than the original submission. The main theorem is now more general, the computational section is more general and informative. The paper is a better paper as a result of the process.

The publishing process is subjective, there is a lot of uncertainty.

Different editors and referees will see the same work differently.

Don't take it personally if your paper gets rejected from the *American Economic Review*.

- Then it quietens down, but ramps back up in March / April.





The interview

The interview

Could involve

- A *job talk* (a presentation of your job market paper)
- A teaching presentation
- A panel interview
- A sequence of meetings
- Meals

The job talk

- Your job talk will normally be around 30-45 minutes.
- But it must be pitched at a general interest audience.
- Also keep in mind that your suitability for teaching is being examined.
- Smile, be nice.

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Teaching presentations

- Normally around 25 minutes.
- These are more tricky in a way.
- Treat the audience as students.
- Find out beforehand what the intended level is.
- Make deliberate choices about content and delivery.

The panel interview

Along with the standard interview questions

- Publishing plans
- Grant funding plans
- Plans for co-authorship within the department (and with other academics from other departments)
- Teaching questions

Non-interview meetings and meals

- Identify and contact people with similar research interests to meet on the day of your interview.
- These meetings are not formal interviews, but they can have an influence.
- Be nice.
- Talk about research.
- Talk about life at the University and in the city.

Work hard and make sure you're prepared. But also enjoy yourself.
